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Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5031st meeting, held on 13 September 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the letter dated 23 August 2004 from the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) concerning Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2004/679).

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Heraldo Muñoz, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) concerning Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Australia, India, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, the Netherlands and Singapore, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

Report of the Secretary-General on the Sudan (*see* S/2004/20/Add.23, 30 and 35; *see also* S/2003/40/Add.40 and S/2004/20/Add.21)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5040th meeting, held on 18 September 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General pursuant to paragraphs 6 and 13 to 16 of Security Council resolution 1556 (2004) (S/2004/703).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of the Sudan, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2004/744) which had been submitted by Germany, Romania, Spain, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2004/744, which received 11 votes in favour (Angola, Benin, Brazil, Chile, France, Germany, Philippines, Romania, Spain, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and United States of America) and none against, with four abstentions (Algeria, China, Pakistan and Russian Federation), and was adopted as resolution 1564 (2004) (for the text, see S/RES/1564 (2004); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).
