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Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5076th and 5079th meetings, held on 15 and 16 November 2004, respectively, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the progress report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Mission of Support in East Timor (S/2004/888).

At the 5076th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Australia, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Portugal, Singapore, Thailand and Timor-Leste, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation

under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Sukehiro Hasegawa, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Timor-Leste and Head of the United Nations Mission of Support in East Timor.

At the 5079th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Timor-Leste, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2004/901) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2004/901, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1573 (2004) (for the text, see S/RES/1573 (2004); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5077th meeting, held on 15 November 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation

under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Terje Roed-Larsen, Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process and Personal Representative of the Secretary-General.

The situation in Côte d'Ivoire (see S/2002/30/Add.50; S/2003/40/Add.5, 17, 19, 29, 31, 45, 47 and 48; and S/2004/20/Add.5, 8, 17, 21, 31 and 44; see also S/2003/40/Add.11 and 44)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5078th meeting, held on 15 November 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Côte d'Ivoire, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2004/892) submitted by Chile, France, Germany, Romania, Spain, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2004/892, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1572 (2004) (for the text, see S/RES/1572 (2004); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).

Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan (see S/2004/20/Add.23, 30, 35, 37, 39, 40 and 44; see also S/2003/40/Add.40; and S/2004/20/Add.21)

The Security Council, by its resolution 1569 (2004) of 26 October 2004, decided to hold meetings in Nairobi starting on 18 November 2004 and ending on 19 November 2004. The Council also decided that the agenda for those meetings would be "Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan".

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5080th, 5081st (private) and 5082nd meetings, held at the United Nations Office at Nairobi on 18 and 19 November 2004 in accordance with the above-mentioned decision.

At the 5080th meeting, held on 18 November 2004, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Kenya, Nigeria, the Sudan and Uganda to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to John Garang, Chairman of the Sudan People's Liberation Movement/Army.

At the close of the 5081st (private) meeting, held on 18 November 2004, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council:

"On 18 November 2004, the Security Council held its 5081st meeting in private.

“His Excellency Mr. Ahmed Aboul-Gheit, Minister for Foreign Affairs of Egypt, was invited to participate in the discussion in accordance with rule 37 of the Council’s provisional rules of procedure.

“His Excellency Mr. Lazarus Sumbeiywo, Special Envoy for the Intergovernmental Authority on Development on the Sudan, was invited to participate in the discussion in accordance with rule 39 of the Council’s provisional rules of procedure.

“The Security Council heard statements by Mr. Aboul-Gheit and Mr. Sumbeiywo.

“Members of the Council, the Secretary-General, His Excellency Mr. Ali Othman Taha, First Vice-President of the Sudan, His Excellency Mr. Aminu B. Wali, Permanent Representative of Nigeria to the United Nations and representative of the Chairman of the African Union, and Mr. John Garang, Chairman of the Sudan People’s Liberation Movement/Army, had a constructive exchange of views.”

At the 5082nd meeting, held on 19 November 2004, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Australia, Japan, the Netherlands, Norway and the Sudan, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council’s prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended invitations under rule 39 of the Council’s provisional rules of procedure to John Garang, Chairman of the Sudan People’s Liberation Movement/Army, and to Samir Hosni, Director of African Administration and African-Arab Cooperation of the League of Arab States.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2004/903) that had been prepared in the course of the Council’s prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2004/903, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1574 (2004) (for the text, see S/RES/1574 (2004); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5083rd meeting, held at the United Nations Office at Nairobi on 19 November 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the situation in Somalia (S/2004/804).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Djibouti, Ethiopia, Kenya, Nigeria and Somalia to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Bethuel Kiplagat, the Intergovernmental Authority on Development facilitator.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2004/43; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).

Institutional relationship with the African Union

The Security Council met to consider the item at its 5084th meeting, held at the United Nations Office at Nairobi on 19 November 2004 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Nigeria, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2004/44; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).
