Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/2005/15 of 25 February 2005.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5144th (private) meeting, held on 21 March 2005 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

“At its 5144th meeting, held in private on 21 March 2005, the Security Council considered the item entitled ‘The situation in Georgia’.

“The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Georgia and Germany to participate in the discussion of the item without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council’s provisional rules of procedure.

“The President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council’s provisional rules of procedure to Jean-Marie Guéhenno, Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.

“The members of the Council heard a briefing by Mr. Guéhenno.

“The representative of Georgia made a statement.”

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5145th and 5148th meetings, held on 22 and 24 March 2005, respectively, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the situation in Afghanistan and its implications for international peace and security (S/2005/183).

At the 5145th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Afghanistan, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council’s prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council’s provisional rules of procedure to Jean Arnault, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Afghanistan and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan.

At the 5148th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Afghanistan, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2005/195) that had been prepared in the course of the Council’s prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2005/195, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1589 (2005) (for the text, *see* S/RES/1589 (2005); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2004-31 July 2005*).
