Letter dated 28 June 2006 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council

I have the honour to refer to my letter of 20 June 2006 (S/2006/419), in which I informed the Security Council of the Greentree Agreement of 12 June 2006 between the Republic of Cameroon and the Federal Republic of Nigeria concerning the modalities of withdrawal and transfer of authority in the Bakassi peninsula.

In that agreement, it was decided to establish a follow-up committee to monitor its implementation. The first meeting will take place in Geneva during the first half of July, and its members are the following:

(a) The United Nations is represented by Mr. Kieran Prendergast (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland), who will serve as Chairman of the follow-up committee, and General Seth Kofi Obeng (Ghana);

(b) Cameroon is represented by Mr. Maurice Kamto, Minister Delegate at the Ministry of Justice, and Mr. Joseph Dion-Ngute, Minister Delegate at the Ministry of External Affairs in Charge of the Commonwealth;

(c) Nigeria is represented by Chief Bayo Ojo, Minister of Justice and Attorney General of the Federation, and Mr. Sunday Ehindero, Inspector General of the Nigerian Police.

The four witness States to the Greentree Agreement (France, Germany, the United Kingdom and the United States of America) will also be represented on the follow-up committee.

I should be grateful if you would bring the present letter to the attention of the members of the Security Council.
