Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2007/10 of 9 February 2007, S/2007/10/Add.7 of 2 March 2007, S/2007/10/Add.12 of 5 April 2007 and S/2007/10/Add.15 of 27 April 2007.

During the week ending 28 April 2007, the Security Council took action on the following items:

Meeting of the Security Council with the troop-contributing countries to the United Nations Mission in the Sudan pursuant to resolution 1353 (2001), annex II, sections A and B (see S/2005/15/Add.37; and S/2006/10/Add.11 and 37)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5666th (private) meeting, held on 23 April 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

On 23 April 2007, the Security Council, pursuant to resolution 1353 (2001), annex II, sections A and B, held its 5666th meeting in private with the troop-contributing countries to the United Nations Mission in the Sudan.

The Security Council and the troop-contributing countries heard a briefing under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure by Tayé-Brook Zerihoun, Acting Special Representative of the Secretary-General for the Sudan.

Members of the Council, Mr. Zerihoun and representatives of participating troop-contributing countries had an exchange of views.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5667th meeting, held on 25 April 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Israel, Lebanon and the Syrian Arab Republic, at their request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 19 April 2007 from the Permanent Observer of Palestine to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2007/228), the President, in accordance with the rules of procedure and the previous practice in that regard, invited the Permanent Observer of Palestine to participate in the meeting.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Lynn Pascoe, Under-Secretary-General for Political Affairs.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5668th meeting, held on 27 April 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Liberia, at his request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2007/227) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2007/227, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1753 (2007) (for the text, see S/RES/1753 (2007); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2006-31 July 2007*).
