Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2007/10 of 9 February 2007, S/2007/10/Add.7 of 2 March 2007, S/2007/10/Add.12 of 5 April 2007, S/2007/10/Add.15 of 27 April 2007, S/2007/10/Add.20 of 1 June 2007 and S/2007/10/Add.25 of 6 July 2007.

During the week ending 28 July 2007, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5720th meeting, held on 23 July 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it a letter dated 17 July 2007 from the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 751 (1992) concerning Somalia addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2007/436).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Somalia, at his request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2007/446) submitted by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2007/446, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1766 (2007) (for the text, see S/RES/1766 (2007); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2006-31 July 2007*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5721st meeting, held on 23 July 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, at his request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2007/28; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1 August 2006-31 July 2007*).

Meeting of the Security Council with the troop-contributing countries to the United Nations Mission in Ethiopia and Eritrea pursuant to resolution 1353 (2001), annex II, sections A and B (*see* S/2001/15/Add.37; S/2002/30/Add.10 and 32; S/2003/40/Add.10 and 36; S/2004/20/Add.10 and 36; S/2005/15/Add.9, 35 and 41; S/2006/10/Add.10, 18 and 38; and S/2007/10/Add.2)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5722nd (private) meeting, held on 24 July 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

On 24 July 2007, the Security Council, pursuant to resolution 1353 (2001), annex II, sections A and B, held its 5722nd meeting in private with the troop-contributing countries to the United Nations Mission in Ethiopia and Eritrea.

The Security Council and the troop-contributing countries heard a briefing under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure by Hédi Annabi, Assistant Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5723rd meeting, held on 25 July 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Michael C. Williams, Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process and Personal Representative of the Secretary-General.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5724th (private) meeting, held on 26 July 2007 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the situation in Abkhazia, Georgia (S/2007/439).

At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

At its 5724th meeting, held in private on 26 July 2007, the Security Council considered the item entitled "The situation in Georgia".

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Georgia and Germany to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Hédi Annabi, Assistant Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.

The members of the Council heard a briefing by Mr. Annabi.

The members of the Council heard a statement by Irakli Alasania, Permanent Representative of Georgia.

Members of the Council, Mr. Annabi and Mr. Alasania had an exchange of views.
