

Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, and in accordance with paragraph 7 of the note by the President dated 19 December 2007 (S/2007/749), the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council was seized as at 5 April 2008 is contained in document S/2008/10/Add.13 of 9 April 2008.

The present addendum lists the items on which the Security Council took action during the week ending 26 April 2008. The dates given for each item indicate when the item was first taken up by the Council at a formal meeting, and the most recent formal meeting of the Council held on that item.

Meeting of the Security Council with the troop-contributing countries pursuant to resolution 1353 (2001), annex II, sections A and B (10 September 2001; 21 April 2008)

United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5870th (closed) meeting, held in private on 21 April 2008. At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, a communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record (S/PV.5870).

Security Council resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) (5 November 1999; 21 April 2008)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5871st (closed) meeting, held in private on 21 April 2008. At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, a communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record (S/PV.5871).



Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan (11 June 2004; 22 April 2008)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5872nd meeting, held on 22 April 2008. Under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure, the Council extended invitations to Rodolphe Adada, Joint African Union/United Nations Special Representative for Darfur, and John Holmes, Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator.

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question (3 October 2000; 23 April 2008)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5873rd meeting, held on 23 April 2008. Under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure, the Council extended an invitation to Angela Kane, Assistant Secretary-General for Political Affairs.

The situation in Georgia (8 October 1992; 23 April 2008)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5874th (closed) meeting, held in private on 23 April 2008. At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, a communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record (S/PV.5874).

Meeting of the Security Council with the troop-contributing countries pursuant to resolution 1353 (2001), annex II, sections A and B (10 September 2001; 24 April 2008)

United Nations Mission in the Sudan

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5875th (closed) meetings, held in private on 24 April 2008. At the close of the meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, a communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record (S/PV.5875).

The situation in Burundi (25 October 1993; 24 April 2008)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5876th meeting, held on 24 April 2008. The Council, under rule 37 of its provisional rules of procedure, invited the representative of Burundi, at his request, to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote. The President, on behalf of the Council, made a statement (S/PRST/2008/10).

Non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction (22 April 2004; 25 April 2008)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 5877th meeting, held on 25 April 2008. The Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2008/273, submitted by China, Croatia, France, Italy, the Russian Federation, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1810 (2008).
