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Letter dated 9 May 2008 from the Secretary-General to the President of the Security Council

I refer to my letter to the President of the Security Council, dated 11 March 2008 (S/2008/175). In that letter, I informed the Security Council that the processing of the authentication documents remained slow and I recommended that the situation be reviewed by the Working Group early in May 2008 on the basis of the results achieved as at 30 April 2008 and stated my intention to provide a follow-up report to the Security Council thereafter.

Following my recommendation to the Security Council, a meeting of the Working Group was held in Amman from 1 to 5 May 2008 to address and resolve outstanding issues, in particular, issues arising from the claims of suppliers that were enumerated in the note attached to my letter of 11 March 2008. In this respect, I hereby transmit the full report of the Working Group outlining the progress made with respect to the issues involved (see enclosure).

The Security Council may recall that, at the meeting of the Working Group that was held in Amman in January 2008, it was reported that there were 210 outstanding letters of credit as at 31 December 2007. As shown in the enclosed report, I am pleased to report that the number of outstanding letters of credit has since decreased to 151, as at 30 April 2008. This decrease is mainly due to the cancellation of 55 letters of credit and the payment in full of 4 letters of credit. However, I should note my concern regarding the slow or non-provision of the necessary authentication documents.

In the context of the meeting of the Working Group from 1 to 5 May 2008, the Government of Iraq has proposed an extension of the time limit to resolve all outstanding issues until 30 June 2008 in order to provide the necessary authentication documents. In addition, the Government of Iraq has proposed that the Working Group meet in July 2008 to finalize its work. In the light of the proposal of the Government of Iraq, I would recommend that the situation be reviewed by the Working Group in July 2008 on the basis of results achieved as at 30 June 2008. If the Council agrees, I shall provide a further progress report in July 2008, after a final meeting of the Working Group.

The Security Council may then review and take a decision on how to resolve outstanding issues, including, but not limited to, the establishment of a dispute resolution mechanism as proposed in my letter to the President of the Security Council dated 7 December 2007 (S/2007/725).



The Security Council may recall that I had proposed in my letter of 11 March 2008 that some unencumbered funds be released and transferred to the Development Fund for Iraq pursuant to Security Council resolution 1483 (2003). The Security Council's guidance is now sought regarding the timing of any possible transfer of such funds to the Development Fund for Iraq.

Meeting of the Working Group regarding the termination of the operations of the letters of credit for the oil-for-food programme

Amman, 1 to 5 May 2008

I. Introduction

- 1. At meetings held in Jordan between the representatives of the Government of Iraq and the United Nations Secretariat on 20 and 21 November 2007 to discuss arrangements for the termination of the operations of the oil-for-food programme, it was agreed that a working group made up of members of the Secretariat, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Iraq, the Central Bank of Iraq and the relevant ministries of the Government of Iraq would be set up in order to minimize the number of unpaid letters of credit with pending claims of delivery issued in relation to the programme.
- 2. In a letter from the Secretary-General to the President of the Security Council dated 7 December 2007 (S/2007/725), the Secretary-General proposed the establishment of a claims settlement mechanism to bring the programme to an orderly and timely closure should issues remain unresolved following the meetings of the Working Group.
- 3. A first meeting of the Working Group was held in Amman from 7 to 17 January 2008. In a letter from the Secretary-General to the President of the Security Council dated 23 January 2008 (S/2008/41), the Secretary-General transmitted the results of the meeting of the Working Group to the Security Council, outlining the progress made with respect to the letters of credit still outstanding.
- 4. In a letter from the President of the Security Council to the Secretary-General dated 29 February 2008 (S/2008/140), the Council members welcomed the positive developments between the Secretariat and the relevant ministries and authorities of the Government of Iraq at the Working Group meetings. In the letter, the members of the Council called upon the Working Group to continue its efforts expeditiously to resolve all outstanding issues and requested a further comprehensive report by 15 March 2008.
- 5. In a letter from the Secretary-General to the President of the Security Council dated 11 March 2008 (S/2008/175), the Secretary-General reported progress made with regard to letters of credit still outstanding. He informed the Security Council that the processing of the authentication documents by the Government of Iraq remained slow. The Secretary-General recommended that the situation be reviewed by the Working Group early in May 2008 on the basis of the results achieved as at 30 April 2008 and stated his intention to provide a follow-up report to the Security Council thereafter.
- 6. Following the recommendation of the Secretary-General, a meeting of the Working Group was held in Amman from 1 to 5 May 2008. The Working Group met to address and resolve issues arising from 167 letters of credit that were reported to the Security Council in the letter from the Secretary-General to the President of the Security Council, dated 11 March 2008. In the context of the meeting, the Working Group reviewed all outstanding claims so that the ministries concerned could

confirm the delivery of the goods in each case and issue and transmit the necessary confirmations of arrival at the earliest possible time thereafter.

II. Status of the programme and developments since the January 2008 meetings of the Working Group

- 7. The Working Group was briefed on the status of the processing of unpaid letters of credit as at 30 April 2008. It was noted that the number of letters of credit decreased from 210 at the end of December 2007 to 151 at the end of April 2008 (see tables 1.A and 1.B). This decrease was mainly due to the 55 letters of credit that were cancelled between 1 January and 30 April 2008 (see annex IV). It was also noted that the number of letters of credit with claims of delivery decreased from 164 (with a value of approximately US\$ 175 million) at the end of December 2007 to 143 (with a value of approximately \$294 million) at the end of April 2008 (see tables 1.A and 1.B). The increase in the value of claims is due in part to new shipments made in December 2007 and the presentation of documents in 2008 to BNP Paribas by the beneficiaries of letters of credit and in part to the strengthening of the euro against the United States dollar for those letters of credit denominated in euros. In addition, payments against 23 letters of credit (see annex V) were processed since the January 2008 meeting of the Working Group.
- 8. The Secretariat noted that the number of unpaid letters of credit with claims of delivery was not significantly reduced since the previous meeting of the Working Group, in January 2008. The Secretariat noted also that, in the absence of progress in processing letters of credit with claims of delivery, those letters of credit would remain unresolved and the corresponding cash collateral would continue to be held in the United Nations Iraq Account.

9. As a result of the meetings of the Working Group and a comprehensive and intensive review of the letters of credit still unpaid as at 30 April 2008, the Working Group prepared the status report on outstanding letters of credit related to the programme (tables 2 to 4). Representatives of the Ministry of Trade, responsible for 45 letters of credit, were not able to participate in the meetings of the Working Group and transmitted their comments in writing.

10. The Secretariat noted that the summary status shows a very significant number of letters of credit with outstanding claims of delivery still unresolved. The Secretariat noted also that, while a number of confirmations of arrival were expected by the end of March 2008 in accordance with the results of the previous meeting of the Working Group, there were 78 letters of credit with pending claims of delivery still outstanding. Accordingly, the Secretariat reiterated that, in the absence of a confirmation of arrival, in all of such cases, the respective letter of credit would remain unresolved and the corresponding cash collateral would continue to be held in the United Nations Iraq Account.

III. Letters of credit identified for cancellation by the Government of Iraq

- 11. In January 2008, the Working Group had agreed to review 57 letters of credit identified for cancellation by the Government of Iraq in annex IV to the report of the meeting of the Working Group attached to the Secretary-General's letter to the President of the Security Council dated 23 January 2008 (S/2008/41). Of the 57 letters of credit identified, the Bank cancelled 42 and one was fully paid. However, 14 letters of credit could not be cancelled as there were outstanding claims of delivery.
- 12. In a continuing effort to move towards the termination of the operations of the programme, the Secretariat has continued to regularly review letters of credit that have expired on their own terms with no claims of delivery. As a result of this continued review, the Bank was able to cancel 13 additional letters of credit with no claims of delivery. Accordingly, the corresponding cash collateral was released from the collateral portion to the non-collateral portion of the United Nations Iraq Account and would be available, in principle, for transfer to the Development Fund for Iraq pursuant to Security Council resolution 1483 (2003).
- 13. In the context of the meetings of the Working Group, the concerned ministries identified 50 additional letters of credit for cancellation (see annex II) where the concerned ministries indicated that the goods and/or services associated with those specific letters of credit did not arrive or the services were not provided in Iraq. As in the past, the Secretariat agreed to review the letters of credit identified but pointed out that the majority of the letters of credit identified by the concerned ministries have outstanding claims of delivery.

IV. Claims against letters of credit that have been cancelled

- 14. With regard to certain contracts prioritized in accordance with Security Council resolution 1483 (2003), the Working Group identified certain cases where claims of delivery for shipments made within the validity of the related letter of credit were communicated or discovered after the respective letter of credit had been cancelled.
- 15. The representatives of the Government of Iraq were briefed on the circumstances of each of those letters of credit and were provided with the relevant documentation. The Secretariat noted that, in the absence of a resolution of the respective claims of delivery, those letters of credit would also remain unresolved.

V. Status of the United Nations Iraq Account

16. As at 30 April 2008, the United Nations Iraq Account (escrow account) contained \$1.032 million which is composed of \$215 million and €524 million held in the euro sub-account with an equivalent value of \$817 million (at a rate of 1.5576). Of the total amount of \$1.032 million, approximately \$523 million is currently held in the cash collateral portion of the escrow account for expired letters of credit to cover claims of delivery made by suppliers. The remaining amount of \$509 million is currently held in the non-collateral portion of the escrow account

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which corresponds to the following amounts: (a) \$187 million which is being held in the escrow account as a reserve for any unanticipated claims until such date as all unresolved issues relating to the programme are finally resolved pursuant to paragraph 16 of the note attached to the Secretary-General's letter to the President of the Security Council dated 10 July 2006 (S/2006/510); (b) \$225 million originally held in the escrow account as collateral in respect of expired letters of credit which have not been transferred to the Development Fund for Iraq pending the resolution of claims of delivery from suppliers in those cases where the Government of Iraq has not issued authentication documents pursuant to the notes attached to the letters of the Secretary-General to the President of the Security Council dated 25 July 2007 (S/2007/476), 7 December 2007 (S/2007/725) and 23 January 2008 (S/2008/41); and (c) \$97 million composed of \$82 million from recently cancelled letters of credit and any unrealized gains from the strengthening of the euro against the United States dollar.

VI. Conclusions of the meeting of the Working Group

- 17. The Secretariat noted the very limited progress achieved with regard to the processing and issuance of confirmations of arrival related to unpaid letters of credit with claims of delivery since the previous meeting of the Working Group (see S/2008/41). The Secretariat highlighted that the Security Council has repeatedly expressed its concern about the problem of slow or non-provision of authentication documents.
- 18. The Secretariat reiterated also the need for the Government of Iraq to process the confirmations of arrival related to letters of credit to make it possible to terminate the operations of the programme. In the absence of such confirmations, the Secretariat emphasized that a dispute resolution mechanism might be deemed necessary, as proposed by the Secretary-General in his letter to the President of the Security Council dated 7 December 2007 (S/2007/725).
- 19. The Government of Iraq acknowledged the Secretariat's position and indicated that it would expedite the issuance of such confirmations of arrival and the resolution of all outstanding issues. In relation to the transfer of funds to the Development Fund for Iraq and the establishment of the claims settlement mechanism, the Government of Iraq proposed that the deadline for providing the confirmations and resolving the disputes between the buyers and the sellers be extended to 30 June 2008. In addition, the Government of Iraq proposed that the Working Group meet in July 2008 to finalize its work. The Government of Iraq requested that during this period funds be kept in the escrow account. Should issues remain unresolved following the meetings of the Working Group in July 2008, the Government of Iraq declared that it would be supportive of any decision of the Security Council to resolve outstanding issues including, but not limited to, the establishment of a dispute resolution mechanism. The Secretariat noted that it lacked authority to agree to such proposal as this would require the express approval of the Security Council. The Secretariat agreed to bring the Government of Iraq's proposal to the attention of the Secretary-General.
- 20. The Secretariat reiterated that the United Nations has no indemnification from the Government of Iraq on the funds that have been transferred and will be transferred to the Development Fund for Iraq, as indicated in the letter of the

Secretary General to the President of the Security Council dated 10 July 2006 (S/2006/510).
