Report of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006)

I. Introduction

1. The present report of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) covers the period from 1 January to 31 December 2010.
2. During the reporting period, the Bureau of the Committee consisted of Ertuğrul Apakan (Turkey) as Chairperson, with the delegations of Lebanon and Nigeria providing the Vice-Chairs. In 2010, the Committee held five sessions of informal consultations. The Chair of the Committee, together with the Coordinator of the Panel of Experts, carried out an open briefing to the wider United Nations membership on 20 December 2010 to inform United Nations Member States about the activities of the Committee and the Panel of Experts, including the adoption of a comprehensive Programme of Work, cooperation with Member States, preparation of documents to assist implementation, and efforts made to improve national reporting requirements, as well as a videoconference held with Professor Siegfried Hecker, concerning his report on the construction of an enrichment facility and a light-water research reactor in Yongbyon. II. Background and activities of the Committee

A. Background

3. The Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) was mandated to oversee the implementation of the measures imposed by that resolution with respect to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. On 12 June 2009, the Security Council unanimously adopted resolution 1874 (2009), in which it imposed additional measures, including an expansion of the embargo on arms and related materiel and technology, as well as the financial measures to include a ban on financial transactions, technical training, advice services or assistance related to such arms and materiel. In resolution 1874 (2009), the Council requested the Secretary-General to create for an initial period of one year a group of up to seven experts to assist the Committee in carrying out its tasks. In paragraph 1 of resolution 1928 (2010), the Security Council extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts.

B. Identification of items and designation of entities subject to measures imposed in resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009)

4. Pursuant to paragraph 8 of resolution 1718 (2006) and paragraph 24 of resolution 1874 (2009), the Committee designated items listed in document S/2009/205 as subject to the measures imposed in paragraphs 8 (a), (b) and (c) of resolution 1718 (2006), eight entities as subject to the provisions of and the measures imposed in paragraph 8 (d), and five individuals subject to the measures imposed in paragraphs 8 (d) and (e) of the same resolution.

C. Programme of work

5. In accordance with paragraph 25 of resolution 1874 (2009), on 26 November 2010, the Committee adopted its new programme of work for the period from 1 November 2010 to 31 October 2011, covering a range of activities related to compliance, investigations, outreach, dialogue, assistance and cooperation to enable the Committee, with the support of the Panel of Experts, to carry out its mandate effectively.

D. Reports from Member States on the implementation of resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009)

6. During the reporting period, 14 Member States reported to the Committee pursuant to paragraph 22 of resolution 1874 (2009) on the steps they had taken to implement effectively the provisions of paragraph 8 of resolution 1718 (2006), as well as paragraphs 9 and 10 of resolution 1874 (2009), and on the financial measures set out in paragraphs 18, 19 and 20 of resolution 1874 (2009). In accordance with its Programme of Work, the Committee agreed to conduct and complete, with the assistance of the Panel of Experts, established pursuant to paragraph 26 of resolution 1874 (2009), as appropriate, a comprehensive review of the reports received from Member States pursuant to paragraph 11 of resolution 1718 (2006), and paragraph 22 of resolution 1874 (2009), on concrete measures they had taken in order to implement effectively the provisions of paragraph 8 of resolution 1718 (2006), paragraphs 9 and 10 of resolution 1874 (2009), as well as financial measures set out in paragraphs 18, 19 and 20 of resolution 1874 (2009).

7. On 8 March 2010, the Panel of Experts submitted to the Committee a quarterly report on the implementation by Member States of resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009), covering the period 30 November 2009 to 28 February 2010. In response to the Committee's request, the report included recommendations on how the level of implementation of the resolutions might be enhanced. On 3 June 2010, the Panel of Experts submitted to the Committee a quarterly report on the implementation by Member States of resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009), covering the period from 1 March to 31 May 2010.

8. On 18 February 2010, the Committee sent a note verbale to all Member States, drawing their attention to the reporting obligations set out in paragraph 22 of Security Council resolution 1874 (2009) and informing them of reports received from several States about difficulties faced by their diplomatic missions in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. In that regard, the Committee reminded all Member States that legitimate transactions involving foreign diplomatic missions located in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea were specifically exempt from the provisions of paragraphs 8 (a) (iii) and 8 (d) of resolution 1718 (2006).

9. On 10 August 2010, the Committee approved an Implementation Assistance Notice to provide helpful information to Member States about the roles of the Committee and the Panel of Experts in investigating sanctions violations. The Committee posted the Implementation Assistance Notice on its website, www.un.org/sc/committees/1718, and circulated it to Member States as a note verbale dated 3 September 2010.

10. At the initiative of the Russian Federation, the Committee also engaged in a discussion on the unintended effects of sanctions on the Democratic People's Republic of Korea upon the work of diplomatic missions in that country. Committee members took note of these concerns and pledged to study the issue further.

E. Panel of Experts

11. In accordance with paragraph 26 of resolution 1874 (2009), the Security Council requested the Secretary-General, in consultation with the Committee, to appoint a Panel of up to seven experts for an initial period of one year. On 7 June 2010, the Security Council extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 12 June 2011. On 8 July 2010, in accordance with paragraph 1 of resolution 1928 (2010), the Secretary-General reappointed the Panel of Experts established pursuant to paragraph 26 of resolution 1874 (2009). Owing to pending professional and personal commitments, three of the experts, Victor D. Comras (United States of America, expert on finance), Masahiko Asada (Japan, expert on nuclear issues) and David J. Birch (United Kingdom, proliferation of weapons of mass destruction) withdrew from the Panel effective 1 October, 12 October and 20 December 2010, respectively. On 14 October, the Secretary-General appointed George A. Lopez (United States of America, expert on finance) and Takehiko Yamamoto (Japan, expert on nuclear issues) to serve on the Panel of Experts established pursuant to resolution 1874 (2009) and carry out tasks as specified in paragraph 26 of that resolution.

12. On 12 May 2010, pursuant to paragraph 26 of resolution 1874 (2009), the Panel of Experts submitted to the Security Council its final report (S/2010/571) containing conclusions and 23 recommendations. On 10 November 2010, the Panel of Experts submitted to the Security Council its midterm report pursuant to paragraph 2 of Security Council resolution 1928 (2010), outlining issues related to the implementation of resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009), recalling its May 2010 recommendations and detailing areas to which special attention should be devoted. On 6 December 2010, the Committee discussed the midterm report and relevant issues.

13. On 21 May 2010, the Panel of Experts submitted to the Committee, for its consideration, three discussion papers relating to paragraph 8 (a) (iii) (luxury goods) of resolution 1718 (2006), paragraph 10 (small arms and light weapons) of resolution 1874 (2009), and paragraph 21 (activities of diplomatic missions) of resolution 1874 (2009). At the informal meeting held on 1 July 2010, the Panel of Experts briefed the Committee on the aforementioned papers. The Committee is currently considering implementation assistance notices on guidance on luxury goods and on the preparation and submission of national implementation reports.

14. On 1 February, the Committee addressed a letter to the Panel of Experts informing them of the modalities for their travels. During the reporting period, at the invitation of the countries concerned, the Panel of Experts conducted visits to Australia (1-2 March 2010); Austria (9-10 March 2010 and 15 September 2010); Belgium (21-23 February 2010, 21 September 2010 and 29-30 November 2010); China (5-9 September 2010); Israel (12-13 August 2010); Japan (26-28 January and 25-27 August 2010); Malaysia (25-26 February 2010); the Republic of Korea (15-16 August 2010); the Russian Federation (17-19 February); Singapore

(23-24 February 2010 and 20-24 August 2010); Thailand (18-20 August); Ukraine (8-10 June 2010); the United Arab Emirates (10-12 October 2010); Washington, D.C., United States (23 November and 13-15 December 2010) to hear briefings and have discussions on the measures taken by these countries to implement resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009), and other related issues. The Panel of Experts submitted to the Committee reports on these visits.

F. Communications from and to Member States related to alleged violations of the measures imposed in resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009)

15. During the reporting period, the Committee received three new reports of alleged violations of resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009) as well as information on previously reported cases of alleged violations.

16. At the invitation of a Member State, the Committee requested the Panel of Experts to conduct an onsite visit in connection with a case of alleged sanctions violation reported to the Committee in 2009 (see S/2010/28, para. 17). The visit was conducted from 10 to 12 October 2010. Following the completion of the investigation, the Committee addressed a letter to the reporting State dated 10 December 2010, conveying no objection to the disposal of seized prohibited items.

17. In relation to an alleged violation (*ibid.*, para. 18) reported to the Committee by a Member State in a letter dated 12 October 2009, the Panel of Experts submitted to the Committee additional information obtained during its on-site visit. The Committee received two unsolicited letters dated 7 January and 6 July 2010 from a Member State denying any involvement with the case. In communications dated 29 January and 28 December 2010, a member of the Committee stated that its authorities did not consider the reported incident as a violation of the sanctions imposed by resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009). In the meantime, in a letter dated 1 December, the reporting State informed the Committee that in the absence of the Committee's guidance on the disposal of the aforementioned cargo by the end of 2010, its authorities would dispose of the seized cargo.

18. In connection with the case referred to the Committee by a Member State in a letter dated 28 December 2009, the Committee addressed several relevant Member States requesting additional information (*ibid.*, para. 19). The Committee received letters from five Member States: a letter dated 5 April 2010, a letter dated 16 April 2010, a letter dated 19 April 2010, a letter dated 22 June 2010 and a letter dated 8 July 2010. At the request of the reporting State, the Panel of Experts conducted an on-site visit from 18 to 19 August 2010 and provided a report to the Committee thereon on 1 September 2010. Following the completion of the investigation, the Committee addressed a letter to the reporting State dated 31 December 2010, which conveyed no objection to the disposal of seized prohibited items.

19. A communication by a Member State dated 28 December 2010 provided additional information about a violation reported earlier in a letter from that Member State dated 23 December 2010.

20. The first new case of alleged violation of resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009) during the reporting period was brought to the Committee's attention by a

Member State in a note verbale dated 18 February 2010. Following consultations among the Committee members, letters requesting additional information were sent to six relevant Member States. In reply to these communications, the Committee received one letter dated 21 April 2010; two letters dated 25 and 26 March 2010; and a note verbale dated 13 May 2010.

21. The Committee received a report of the second case of alleged violation in a note verbale dated 21 April 2010 from a Member State, to which the Committee replied in a note verbale dated 3 June 2010.

22. The third case of attempted violation was reported to the Committee by a Member State in a letter dated 22 June 2010. The reporting State informed the Committee that relevant entities under its jurisdiction had acted responsibly in accordance with the reporting State's obligations under the relevant provisions of resolutions 1718 (2006) and 1874 (2009), and had cooperated fully with the Committee and the Panel of Experts in preventing the attempted violation and the subsequent investigation of the case.

G. Other communications from and to Member States

23. In a letter dated 23 July 2010 from a Member State, the Committee was requested to clarify whether certain equipment could be considered as subject to the measures imposed by the Security Council in paragraph 8 of its resolution 1718 (2006) and paragraph 9 of its resolution 1874 (2009). Upon receiving additional technical specifications from the Member State and having consulted the Panel of Experts, the Committee responded to the requesting State by notes verbale dated 20 August and 16 September 2010.

24. The Committee received two letters from a Member State dated 23 and 27 December 2010, requesting the opinion of the Panel of Experts concerning a request received by one of its financial institutions. The Committee is considering the matter in consultations with the Panel of Experts.
