Summary statement by the Secretary-General of matters of which the Security Council is seized and of the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

1. Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council and in accordance with the note by the President dated 30 August 2017 ([S/2017/507](#)), the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.
