## Colombia, Cuba, Malaysia and Yemen: draft resolution

The Security Council,

Reaffirming the obligations of Member States under the United Nations Charter,

Reaffirming further the principle of the inadmissibility of the acquisition of territory by war,

Having received the report of the Secretary-General submitted in accordance with Security Council resolution 672 (1990) on ways and means for ensuring the safety and protection of the Palestinian civilians under Israeli occupation,

<u>Gravely concerned</u> at the rejection of Security Council resolutions 672 (1990) and 673 (1990) by the Israeli Government,

Gravely concerned further at the dangerous deterioration of the situation in the Palestinian territory occupied by Israel since 1967, including Jerusalem,

Stressing the need for negotiated settlement of the Middle East conflict, with the objectives of ending Israeli occupation to Palestinian and other Arab territories, security for all States in the region, including Israel, and fulfilling the legitimate political rights of the Palestinian people,

- Expresses its appreciation to the Secretary-General for his report contained in document S/21919;
- <u>Deplores</u> the refusal of the Israeli Government to comply with Security Council resolutions 672 (1990) and 673 (1990);
- <u>Urges</u> the Government of Israel to accept the <u>de\_iure</u> applicability of the Fourth Geneva Convention of 1949, to all occupied territories since 1967, including Jerusalem, and to abide scrupulously by the provisions of the said Convention:
- Calls upon the high contracting parties to the Fourth Geneva Convention to ensure respect by Israel, the occupying Power, for the Convention under all circumstances, in accordance with article 1 of the said Convention;

- 5. <u>Endorses</u> the idea of convening a meeting for the high contracting parties of the Fourth Geneva Convention to discuss possible measures to be taken by them under the Convention;
- 6. <u>Decides</u> that the military observers stationed in Jerusalem at the headquarters of the United Nations Truce Supervision Organization, be deployed in the occupied Palestinian territories as necessary in order to monitor and observe the situation, and to report on it to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and to the Security Council;
- 7. Requests the Secretary-General to provide UNTSO with the necessary staff and facilities to assist in carrying out the function assigned to it under this resolution and further requests the Secretary-General to report within one month on the implementation of this resolution to the Council:
- 8. <u>Welcomes</u> the calls for convening, at an appropriate time a properly structured international peace conference, with the participation of the parties concerned, to facilitate the achievement of negotiated settlement and lasting peace in the Middle East;
- 9. Requests the Secretary-General to report on the fulfilment of the above provisions, and decides to reconvene as necessary to consider the situation.
