OKIGINAL: ENGLISH

Colombia, Cuba, Malaysia and Yemen: revised draft resolution

The Security Council,

Beaffirming the obligations of Member States under the United Nations Charter,

 $\underline{Reaffirminq\ further}$ the principle of the inadmissibility of the acquisition of territory by war,

<u>Having received</u> the report of the Secretary-General submitted in accordance with security Council resolution 672 (1990) on ways and means for ensuring the safety and protection of the Palestinian civilians under Israeli occupation,

<u>Considering</u> it necessary to increase the impartial international presence in the occupied territories,

<u>Gravely concerned</u> at the dangerous deterioration of the situation in the Palestinian territory occupied by Israel since 1967, including Jerusalem,

<u>Stressing</u> the need for **negotiated** settlement **of** the Middle East conflict, with the objectives of ending Israeli occupation of the Palestinian and other Arab territories, security for all States in the region, including Israel, and **fulfilling** the legitimate political rights **of the** Palestinian people,

1. <u>Expresses</u> its appreciation to the Secretary-General for his report contained **in** document **S/21919**;

Z. <u>Deplores</u> the **refusal** of the Israeli Government to comply with Security **Council** resolutions 672 (1990) and 673 (1990) ;

3. <u>Urges</u> the **Government** of Israel to accept the de **jure** applicability of the Fourth Geneva Convention of 1949, to all **occupied** territories since 1967, including Jerusalem, and to abide scrupulously by the provisions of the said Convention;

4. <u>Calls upon the high contracting parties to the Fourth Geneva Convention</u> to ensure respect by Israel, the occupying Power, for the Convention under all circumstances, in accordance with article 1 of the said Convention:

5. - Endorses the idea of convening a meeting for the high contracting parties of the Fourth Geneva Convention to discuss possible measures to be taken by them under the Convention;

6. <u>Decides</u> to appoint a Commissioner ("ombudsman") to the occupied Palestinian territories to monitor and observe the situation. With the help of the United Nations personnel. stationed there, and to report on it to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and to the Security Council:

7. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary--General to nominate a Commissioner and to provide him with the necessary staff to accomplish his task, and ta report within one month on the implementation of this resolution to the Council;

8. <u>Welcomes</u> the calls for convening, at an appropriate time a properly structured international. peace conference, with the participation of the parties concerned, to facilitate the achievement of negotiated settlement and lasting peace in the Middle East;

9. <u>Decides</u> to reconvene as necessary to consider the situation.
