Report of Lesotho on counter-terrorism measures, pursuant to paragraphs 6 and 12 of resolution 1455 (2003)

1. There have been no reports of any activity linked to Al-qaida, the Taliban and Usama Bin Laden and their associates as of now in Lesotho. The activities of Usama Bin Laden and Al-qaida could pose a threat to the stability of our country and the region.
