#### **2. Civil/criminal and other penalties**

##### **Border control measures for weapons of mass destruction**

The National Customs Service assists the National Authority in controlling these weapons by efficiently monitoring foreign trade operations involving the importation and/or exportation of the biological, chemical or nuclear weapons prohibited under international conventions.

The Customs Service proceeds as follows:

- If the customs authorities discover that a foreign trade operation involving weapons of mass destruction does not have the proper authorization, the goods may not enter or leave the country until the required documents are produced.
  - If weapons of mass destruction are discovered during a customs inspection and there is no customs declaration, the goods are seized and the matter is referred to the courts.
  - If smuggled materials related to weapons of mass destruction are seized, the matter is referred to the courts, where it is dealt with in accordance with the criminal procedures reform.
