

La Misión Permanente de Noruega se complace en transmitir por la presente una matriz nacional actualizada sobre su aplicación de la resolución 1540 (2004) del Consejo de Seguridad y las obligaciones en materia de no proliferación establecidas en las resoluciones 1673 (2006), 1810 (2008), 1977 (2011), 2055 (2012) y 2325 (2016) (véase el anexo).

# Informe de Noruega sobre la aplicación de la resolución 1540 (2004) del Consejo de Seguridad

Noruega se complace en transmitir por la presente una matriz nacional actualizada sobre su aplicación de la resolución 1540 (2004) del Consejo de Seguridad y las obligaciones en materia de no proliferación establecidas en las resoluciones 1673 (2006), 1810 (2008), 1977 (2011), 2055 (2012) y 2325 (2016) (véase el apéndice)<sup>1</sup>.

Noruega considera que la resolución 1540 (2004) del Consejo de Seguridad es parte vital de la arquitectura internacional de no proliferación. En la resolución, el Consejo impone a todos los Estados la obligación de adoptar y hacer cumplir medidas eficaces para instaurar controles nacionales a fin de prevenir la proliferación de armas nucleares, químicas o biológicas y de sus sistemas vectores, incluso estableciendo controles adecuados de los materiales conexos. El Consejo alienta también a utilizar el diálogo y la cooperación internacionales para hacer frente a la amenaza que representa la proliferación.

La amenaza que suponen los agentes no estatales es cada vez mayor. Puesto que se trata de una amenaza transnacional, hay que hacerle frente mediante la cooperación internacional. Es responsabilidad conjunta de la comunidad mundial reforzar y cumplir las normas y reglas pertinentes para mejorar la estabilidad, la seguridad y el desarrollo a nivel mundial. Noruega sigue siendo un ardiente defensor de la universalización y el fortalecimiento de los regímenes multilaterales destinados a prevenir la proliferación de armas nucleares, biológicas o químicas, como el Tratado sobre la No Proliferación, la Convención sobre las Armas Químicas y la Convención sobre las Armas Biológicas.

Su plena aplicación por parte de todos los Estados Miembros de las Naciones Unidas es crucial. Noruega procura cooperar con todos los Estados y las partes pertinentes para intensificar los esfuerzos destinados a promover la aplicación universal de la resolución 1540 (2004).

Desde el informe que figura en los documentos S/AC.44/2004/(02)/31 y S/AC.44/2004/(02)/31/Add.1, Noruega ha ratificado los siguientes instrumentos internacionales:

- Enmienda de la Convención sobre la Protección Física de los Materiales Nucleares

## **Implementation matrix**

The information in the matrices originates primarily from national reports and is complemented by official government information, including that made available to inter-governmental organizations. The matrices are prepared under the direction of the 1540 Committee.

The 1540 Committee intends to use the matrices as a reference tool for facilitating technical assistance and to enable the Committee to continue to enhance its dialogue with States on their implementation of Security Council Resolution 1540.

The matrices are not a tool for measuring compliance of States in their non-proliferation obligations but for facilitating the implementation of Security Council Resolutions 1540 (2004), 1673 (2006), 1810 (2008), 1977 (2011), 2055 (2012) and 2325 (2016). They do not reflect or prejudice any ongoing discussions outside of the Committee, in the Security Council or any of its organs, of a State's compliance with its non-proliferation or any other obligations. Information on voluntary commitments is for reporting purpose only and does not constitute in any way a legal obligation arising from resolution 1540 or its successive resolutions.

Matrix entries are only indicators of fact and not indicators of the degree of compliance under resolution 1540 (2004) and its successor resolutions. Thus:

An "X" in any data field signifies only that the 1540 Committee considers that a State has taken the steps required, and/or has provided specific references to the applicable legal basis or executive behaviour as evidence of such steps. An "X" against any data field does not necessarily signify that a State has met in full its 1540 obligations for that data field.

A "?" in any data field signifies that the references to legislative or other measures may not be directly relevant or are incomplete.

A "NA" (Not Applicable) in any data field signifies that the data field is not applicable to that State where through legally binding instruments States specified that they do not possess related materials or facilities.

A blank in any data field signifies that there is insufficient information available to enter an "X" or "?" against a particular data field.
