### Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) concerning the Sudan

#### Note verbale dated 15 July 2015 from the Permanent Mission of Estonia to the United Nations addressed to the Chair of the Committee

The Permanent Mission of Estonia to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) concerning the Sudan. The Mission submits herewith the following report, pursuant to paragraph 13 of resolution 2200 (2015), on the implementation of measures imposed by resolutions 1556 (2004) and 1591 (2005).

In Estonia, paragraphs 7, 8 and 9 of resolution 1556 (2004) are implemented in accordance with articles 1 and 2 of the Council of the European Union Decision 2014/450/CFSP of 10 July 2014 concerning restrictive measures in view of the situation in Sudan and repealing Decision 2011/423/CFSP and pursuant to articles 2 to 4 of the Council of the European Union Regulation (EU) No. 747/2014 of 10 July 2014 concerning restrictive measures in view of the situation in Sudan and repealing Regulations (EC) No. 131/2004 and (EC) No. 1184/2005, which is directly applicable in Estonia, and pursuant to the Strategic Goods Act of Estonia and Weapons Act of Estonia.

In Estonia, paragraph 3 (d) and (f) of resolution 1591 (2005) is implemented in accordance with article 4 of Council Decision 2014/450/CFSP and pursuant to Order No. 283 of 19 June 2014 of the Government of Estonia concerning the implementation of restrictive measures in view of the situation in the Sudan and to the Obligation to Leave and Prohibition on Entry Act of Estonia.

In Estonia, paragraph 3 (e) and (g) of resolution 1591 (2005) is implemented in accordance with article 5 of Council Decision 2014/450/CFSP and pursuant to articles 5 to 8 of the directly applicable Council Regulation (EU) No. 747/2014.

Penalties applicable for failures to apply international sanctions imposed by international organizations are stipulated in article 93<sup>1</sup> of the Penal Code of Estonia.
