**Report of the Republic of Korea on the implementation of
Security Council resolution [2127 \(2013\)](#)**

The Government of the Republic of Korea is committed to faithfully implementing Security Council resolution [2127 \(2013\)](#) and to rendering full cooperation to the Security Council Committee established pursuant to that resolution.

The Republic of Korea possesses the legal and administrative instruments necessary to implement Security Council resolutions and is reflecting the changes to the sanctions lists and the measures introduced by the Council's subsequent actions.

Pursuant to Security Council resolution [2134 \(2014\)](#), the Government of the Republic of Korea has taken the measures necessary to implement paragraph 30 of that resolution, on the travel ban, through its Immigration Control Act and relevant statutes. Also, the Government of the Republic of Korea is currently revising relevant public notices to implement paragraphs 54 and 55 of resolution [2127 \(2013\)](#) and paragraph 40 of resolution [2134 \(2014\)](#), on the arms embargo, through relevant laws, including the Foreign Trade Act, as well as paragraph 32 of resolution [2134 \(2014\)](#), on the assets freeze, through the Foreign Exchange Transactions Act.
