ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The agenda was adopted.

THE SITUATION CONCERNING WESTERN SAHARA

REPORT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL (S/22464 and Corr.1)

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from French): The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda.

Members of the Council have before them document S/22464, containing the text of the report dated 19 April 1991 that the Secretary-General presented pursuant to paragraph 5 of resolution 658 (1990).

Members of the Council also have before them a draft resolution (S/22525), which was drawn up in the course of consultations of the Council.

I wish to draw particular attention to document S/22532, containing the text of the statement made by the Secretary-General on 24 April 1991 to the informal consultations of the Security Council.

I understand that the Council is ready to vote on the draft resolution before it. Unless I hear any objection, I shall now put the draft resolution to the vote. There being no objection, it is so decided.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour: Austria, Belgium, China, Côte d'Ivoire, Cuba, Ecuador, France, India, Romania, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Yemen, Zaire, Zimbabwe

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from French): There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has therefore been adopted unanimously as resolution 690 (1991).
