THE SITUATION IN CYPRUS

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON HIS MISSION OF GOOD OFFICES IN CYPRUS
(S/24830)

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from French): The Security Council is meeting in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

Members of the Council have before them the report of the Secretary-General on his mission of good offices in Cyprus, document S/24830.

Members of the Council also have before them the text of a draft resolution contained in document S/24841, which has been prepared in the course of the Council's consultations.

It is my understanding that the Council is ready to proceed to vote on the draft resolution before it. Unless I hear any objection, I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour: Austria, Belgium, Cape Verde, China, Ecuador, France, Hungary, India, Japan, Morocco, Russian Federation, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Venezuela, Zimbabwe

The PRESIDENT: (interpretation from French): There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 789 (1992).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda.
