Adoption of the agenda

The situation in Timor-Leste

Letter dated 13 June 2006 from the Permanent Representative of Timor-Leste to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General (S/2006/391)

The President: I should like to inform the Council that I have received a letter from the representative of Timor-Leste in which he requests to be invited to participate in the consideration of the item on the Council's agenda. In conformity with the usual practice, I propose, with the consent of the Council, to invite that representative to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

At the invitation of the President, Mr. Guterres (Timor-Leste) took a seat at the Council table.

The President: The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda. The Council is meeting in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

Members of the Council have before them document S/2006/414, which contains the text of a draft resolution prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations. Members also have before them document S/2006/383, which contains a letter date 13 June 2006 from the Secretary-General transmitting a letter from the President, the President of the National Parliament and the Prime Minister of Timor-Leste, and document S/2006/391, which contains a letter dated 13 June 2006 from the Permanent Representative of Timor-Leste transmitting a letter from the Minister for Foreign Affairs and Cooperation and Minister for Defence of Timor-Leste.

It is my understanding that the Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution before it. Unless I hear any objection, I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour:

Argentina, China, Congo, Denmark, France, Ghana, Greece, Japan, Peru, Qatar, Russian Federation, Slovakia, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United Republic of Tanzania, United States of America

The President: There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1690 (2006).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda.
