The President: As this is the first meeting of the Security Council for the month of October, I should like to take this opportunity to pay tribute, on behalf of the Council, to His Excellency Mr. Adamantios Vassilakis, Permanent Representative of Greece, for his service as President of the Security Council for the month of September 2006. I am sure I speak for all members of the Council in expressing deep appreciation to Ambassador Vassilakis for the great diplomatic skill with which he conducted the Council's business last month.

Adoption of the agenda

Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan

Report of the Secretary-General on the Sudan (S/2006/728)

The President: The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda. The Security Council is meeting in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

Members of the Council have before them document S/2006/728, which contains the report of the Secretary-General on the Sudan. Members of the Council also have before them document S/2006/792,

which contains the text of a draft resolution submitted by the United States of America.

I wish to draw the attention of members of the Council to document S/2006/779, containing the text of a letter dated 28 September 2006 from the Secretary-General. I also wish to draw attention to photocopies of a letter dated 3 October 2006 from the Sudan, which will be issued as a document of the Security Council under the symbol S/2006/789.

It is my understanding that the Security Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution (S/2006/792) before it. Unless I hear an objection, I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

Argentina, China, Congo, Denmark, France, Ghana, Greece, Japan, Peru, Qatar, Russian Federation, Slovakia, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United Republic of Tanzania, United States of America

The President: There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1714 (2006).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda.
