RESOLUTION 1245 (1999)

Adopted by the Security Council at its 4012th meeting, $\underline{ \text{on } 11 \text{ June } 1999 }$

The Security Council,

<u>Recalling</u> its resolutions 1181 (1998) of 13 July 1998, 1220 (1999) of 12 January 1999 and 1231 (1999) of 11 March 1999 and the statements of its President of 7 January 1999 (S/PRST/1999/1) and 15 May 1999 (S/PRST/1999/13),

<u>Acknowledging</u> the cooperation provided by the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) and its Military Observer Group (ECOMOG),

 $\underline{\mathtt{Expressing}}$ its continued concern over the fragile situation in Sierra Leone,

Affirming the commitment of all States to respect the sovereignty, political independence and territorial integrity of Sierra Leone,

 $\underline{\text{Having considered}}$ the sixth report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Observer Mission in Sierra Leone (UNOMSIL) of 4 June 1999 (S/1999/645) and $\underline{\text{noting}}$ the recommendations contained therein,

- 1. <u>Decides</u> to extend the mandate of UNOMSIL until 13 December 1999;
- 2. <u>Stresses</u> that an overall political settlement and national reconciliation are essential to achieving a peaceful resolution of the conflict in Sierra Leone, and <u>welcomes</u> the holding of talks in Lomé between the Government of Sierra Leone and rebel representatives;
- 3. <u>Calls upon</u> all concerned to remain committed to the process of negotiation and to demonstrate flexibility in their approach to the process, <u>underlines</u> its strong support for all those involved in the mediation efforts of the United Nations within the Lomé process, in particular the work of the Special Representative of the Secretary-General to facilitate dialogue, and for the key role being played by the President of Togo as current Chairman of ECOWAS, and <u>emphasizes</u> the strong commitment of the international community to support a sustainable peace settlement;

- 4. <u>Takes note</u> of the intention of the Secretary-General, as set out in paragraphs 52 to 57 of his report, to revert to the Council with recommendations on an expanded UNOMSIL presence in Sierra Leone with a revised mandate and concept of operations in the event of a successful outcome to the negotiations between the Government of Sierra Leone and rebel representatives in Lomé, and <u>underlines</u> that further eventual deployment of UNOMSIL should be considered, taking into account security conditions;
- 5. $\underline{\text{Requests}}$ the Secretary-General to keep the Council closely informed on the situation in Sierra Leone;

6. <u>Decides</u> to remain actively seized of the matter.
