Meeting of States Parties Tenth Meeting New York, 22-26 May 2000

Decisions on budgetary matters of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea for 2001

- The Meeting of States Parties approves the budget of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea for 2001, amounting to US\$ 8,090,900, as set out in annex I to the present document, together with the staffing table for the Registry of the Tribunal in 2001, as contained in annexes II and III. In approving the abovementioned amount, the Meeting agrees that the completion of the integrated computer network in the new premises of the Tribunal will be undertaken over a two-year period and that the budgetary implications for the deferred activity in this regard will be considered in relation to the budget of the Tribunal for 2002. The Meeting also agrees that while the request of the Tribunal for two posts at the General Service level for 2001 was not approved, the Tribunal would use temporary assistance for the time being, as necessary, and, as appropriate, will submit a request in the proposed budget for 2002 in the light of this year's experience. The Meeting takes note of the fact that most of the budgetary increase in 2001 over the level of 2000 is attributable to the costs associated with the maintenance, operation and security of the new premises as well as the anticipated level of judicial work.
- With a view to providing the Tribunal with the necessary financial means to consider cases in 2001, in particular those requiring expeditious proceedings, the Meeting further approves an amount of US\$ 863,900 in 2001 as contingency funds of the Tribunal. The contingency funds shall only be used in the event of cases being submitted to the Tribunal.
- The Meeting recalls that the Eighth Meeting of States Parties approved the establishment of a Working Capital Fund for the Tribunal and that it provided on an exceptional basis for up to US\$ 200,000, to be credited to the Fund from savings, if any, from the 1999 appropriations. The Ninth Meeting of States Parties approved an additional amount of US\$ 50,000 for advances to the Working Capital Fund of the Tribunal in 2000. The Ninth Meeting further decided that, on an exceptional basis, savings from appropriations in the budget for 2000, up to a maximum of US\$ 200,000, would also be credited to the Fund. The Meeting approves an additional amount of US\$ 50,000 for advances to the Working Capital Fund of the Tribunal in 2001. Moreover, the Meeting decides that, on an exceptional basis,

savings from appropriations in the budget for 2001, up to a maximum of US\$ 200,000, will also be credited to the Fund.

- 4. Without prejudice to the application of the provisions of article 19 of annex VI to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea in respect of future budgets of the Tribunal regarding the contribution to be made by the International Seabed Authority, the budget of the Tribunal in 2001 including its contingency funds in 2001 and the additional advances to its Working Capital Fund in 2001 amounting to US\$ 50,000, will be financed by all States and international organizations that are Parties to the Convention.
- 5. The contributions to be made by States Parties shall be based upon the scale of assessments for the regular budget of the United Nations for the preceding financial year, adjusted to take account of participation in the Convention. The Meeting of States Parties decided that a floor rate of 0.01 per cent and a ceiling rate of 25.00 per cent will be used in establishing the rate of assessment for States Parties for the budget of the Tribunal for 2001.
