Report of the Secretary-General

Summary

The present report is the fifteenth consolidated report issued by the Secretary-General since the establishment of the Register.** It contains data and information provided by 84 Governments on the international transfers of major conventional arms covered under the Register and/or additional background information for the calendar year 2006. Additional replies received from Governments will be issued as addenda to the present report.

The replies received are contained in section II of the present report. Section III contains an index of background information submitted by Governments on military holdings, procurement through national production, international transfers of small arms and light weapons and national policies. Replies received on military holdings and procurement through national production are contained in section IV. Section V contains replies received from Governments on small arms and light weapons.

Information received from Governments on national policies is available for consultation at the Office for Disarmament Affairs of the Secretariat.

I. Introduction

1. The present report is the fifteenth consolidated report on the United Nations Register of Conventional Arms, and is submitted pursuant to General Assembly resolution 61/77 of 6 December 2006.

2. The Office for Disarmament Affairs has engaged in a number of activities related to the United Nations Register. It attended as an observer and distributed background information on the Register at the Seventh Conference of the Ministers of Defence of the Americas held in Managua from 1 to 5 October 2006. The Office organized an informal meeting on the margin of the First Committee on 9 October 2006 to brief delegates on the outcome of the 2006 review of the Register and other developments related to the Register. The Office for Disarmament Affairs made a presentation and provided background material on the Register to the Hemispheric Security Committee of the Organization of American States at a plenary meeting held in Washington, D.C., on 30 November 2006. It organized a regional workshop on “Transparency in conventional arms” in Bangkok on 6 and 7 December 2006. Representatives of Member States from South and South-East Asia participated in the workshop, which was co-sponsored by the Governments of the Netherlands, Sweden and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. The objectives of the workshop were to increase familiarity with the operation and procedures of the Register, brief officials on the outcome of the 2006 review of the Register by governmental experts and obtain feedback for them for the next review of the Register, which is scheduled to be held in 2009. The Office made a presentation and provided background information to the Forum for Security Cooperation of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe at a plenary meeting held in Vienna on 6 February 2007. The Office also made a presentation at a workshop on “MANPADS and all its aspects” held at the headquarters of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization in Brussels on 6 and 7 June 2007. In addition, the Office produced a number of publications related to the Register in print and electronic versions, including the “Report of the 2006 Group of Governmental Experts: Highlights”, “Information Booklet 2007” and “Guidelines for Reporting International Transfers”, which were printed by the Government of the United Kingdom and can be accessed at the Register web page at <http://disarmament.un.org/cab/register.html>.

II. Information received from Governments¹

3. Information received from Governments is presented below as follows: a composite table listing all the replies received by the Secretary-General (sect. A) and an index of individual replies of Governments (sect. B). Where appropriate, the relevant parts of notes verbales are reproduced.

4. The composite table is provided for ease of reference. As regards the information contained in the table, it should be noted that a “yes” denotes a submission of data regarding imports and/or exports in relation to the seven categories of arms covered by the Register during the reporting period. For the

purpose of uniform tabulation, responses by Governments that contained either “nil”, “none”, “0”, a dash (-) or which otherwise indicated that no exports and/or imports in the categories covered by the Register had taken place are reflected in the tables as “nil” reports. A blank space under data on imports and/or exports in the composite table indicates that no information was provided. In some cases, however, an explanation can be found in the note verbale of the country in question, as indicated above. Only those parts of the standardized forms that contain specific data and notes verbales of Governments providing relevant information are reproduced in section B. Replies in the standardized reporting forms and the simplified “nil” reporting form or in notes verbales containing “nil” or blank reports are listed in the composite table only.

Switzerland

Information on international transfers of small arms and light weapons

“Switzerland has been strongly supporting the establishment of a new category which would have covered all transfers on small arms and light weapons and have made their notification as “mandatory” as in the other seven categories of major conventional weapons systems. Our domestic practice, however, is currently based on a licensing system. Regarding licensed exports or imports, customs services only check upon weights, but not on each and every item. Thus the current procedures don’t allow for an accurate notification of SALW transfers. In view of the further development of the Register, we hope that the number of Member States using the new format will steadily increase and create a critical mass to be able to include a new eighth category. Meanwhile, Switzerland will continue to strongly support the Register, but for the reasons above refrains from notifying inaccurate numbers at a potentially high cost for the credibility of both the Register and the notifying state.”

Bolivia

The arms trade is going through one of its most flourishing phases in history. Year after year the figures reported by various organizations show a spectacular rise in spending, and also in the scandalous profits of the death industry.

In 2006, world military expenditures exceeded the highest level reached during the cold war. It is calculated that they will reach 835 billion euros, a figure 15 times as high as the volume of international humanitarian aid.

It is weapons that feed conflicts, which are in turn the primary cause of famines throughout the world, 35 per cent of the food emergencies that have occurred in recent years having been precipitated by wars. In the meantime, global military expenditure continues to rise and, if the forecasts turn out correct, will exceed the historical maximums reached during the final years of the cold war.

The financial crisis taking place on a world-wide scale will tend to become more acute in the future owing to limited production resulting from the exhaustion of raw materials. This will have a direct impact on the economic income of every State.

Some of the principal purposes of the Charter of the Organization of American States (OAS) are to seek to consolidate peace and security in the continent; guarantee the sovereignty, independence and territorial integrity of States; eradicate poverty; and achieve effective limitation of conventional weapons, so as to permit the investment of greater resources in economic and social development.

Bolivia, conscious of the collateral problems involved in devoting economic resources to the purchase of war materiel, has deemed it appropriate to direct its principal effort toward the creation of sources of work and the elimination of poverty. It is for this reason that in its various interventions in international organizations, Bolivia reaffirms its position as a pacifist country.

The creation of advanced military posts and military bases is not precisely a response to an arms race, but simply to internal needs of security and defence of national territory in keeping with rights existing under international law.

Bearing in mind that peace can be built solely through mutual trust, Bolivia has in the past signed cooperation conventions in the area of bilateral defence and security.

Mention should be made of the position of Bolivia and Chile regarding the need to accelerate the removal of mines from the two countries' frontier, in compliance with the Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-personnel Mines and on Their Destruction (Ottawa Convention).

All States should realize that the real problem that harbours within it a lasting and devastating threat is poverty, even more than international terrorism, to which more interest and attention are devoted.

While Bolivia is a pacifist country, it makes use of its legitimate right to acquire and update its conventional weaponry with a view to its self-defence, as provided in the Charter of the United Nations, always respecting the international policies in force and without shattering the mutual confidence maintained with other States.

Bilateral and regional agreements should be promoted with a view to greater transparency in the acquisition of conventional weapons, as should measures aimed at confidence-building, so as to eliminate tension among States and diminish any possibility of conflict, with a view to reducing military spending.

Common reply of the European Union to General Assembly resolution 61/77 on transparency in armaments

1. The General Assembly, in operative paragraph 7 (a) of its resolution 61/77, requested Member States of the United Nations to provide the Secretary-General with their views on the continuing operation of the Register of conventional arms and its further development and on transparency measures related to weapons of mass destruction.
2. The Member States of the European Union continue to consider transparency in armaments as an important instrument in building confidence and security between States. The Register of conventional arms is an important, concrete and effective measure in this respect.
3. The Register provides data on international arms transfers of those categories of conventional arms which are potentially destabilizing when accumulated excessively. It serves to enhance transparency, build confidence and promote better understanding among states. The Member States of the EU are committed to securing the widest possible participation in the Register to improve its effectiveness. In this context, contacts of the Union with non-participating States in support of securing wider participation have shown that only in exceptional cases non-participation is motivated by disagreement with the concept embodied in the Register.
4. The Member States of the European Union welcome all efforts to further strengthen the role of the Register in the field of conventional arms control. In this respect, the EU reiterates the broadening of the scope of the Register in 2003 by lowering of the reporting threshold of artillery systems from 100 mm to 75 mm, and the inclusion of Man-Portable Air-Defence Systems as a subcategory under the existing category of Missiles and Missile Launchers.
5. The Member States of the European Union welcome the consensus report of the 2006 Group of Governmental Experts, the recommendations therein and the decision of the United Nations General Assembly to adapt the scope of the register accordingly. The 2006 Group of Governmental Experts has built on the achievements of the 2003 Group, whose work paved the way for the first expansion of the scope of the Register.
6. In 2006 again, a broadening of the scope of the Register has been established, which entails three important developments. Firstly, it has been agreed that international transfers of conventional arms involving only Member States of the United Nations should be reported to the Register. Secondly, the notification commitment regarding the sixth category of the Register has been extended. This will result in a wider information exchange on warships and submarines, including all naval vessels under the threshold of 500 metric tons that are armed with missiles and/or torpedoes with a range of at least 25 km. Thirdly, the 2006 Group of Governmental Experts has developed an optional standardized form for notification

of transfer of small arms and light weapons. Earlier resolutions on transparency in armaments already called on Member States of the United Nations to provide additional information on transfers of small arms and light weapons, using definitions and reporting measures they deemed appropriate. However, with the reference in resolution 61/77 to the optional standardized form, notification on these kinds of weapons will be more accessible to States willing to do so.

7. The Member States of the European Union thus express their hope and expectation that the existence of the optional standardized form will make more States submit small arms information to the Register in the coming years. As the Secretary-General expressed in his note transmitting the report of the Group of Governmental Experts in August 2006, the European Union believes this result marks a step towards overcoming the lack of transparency in the area of small arms and should also help in combating illicit trafficking of these arms. It is therefore an important development for the Register.

8. The Member States of the European Union express the hope that the 2009 review of the United Nations Register of Conventional Arms will build upon the success of the 2003 and 2006 reviews and further expand the scope of the Register. In particular, the European Union would welcome an expansion of the Register by a separate category of data on procurement through national production and military holdings and/or a standardized form therefor.

9. Most notably, the inclusion of small arms and light weapons in a separate category of the Register remains the highest priority of the European Union. The inclusion of these kinds of weapons in a separate category would stimulate United Nations Member States even more to report on their small arms and light weapons transfers, which are a crucial element of transparency in armaments in many parts of the world.

10. The Register should provide a framework for all Member States of the United Nations to afford transparency in their transfers of arms that are potentially destabilizing. In effect, small arms and light weapons have been particularly destabilizing in the majority of armed conflicts in recent years. In this regard, the European Union appreciates the Secretary-General's expression of support to include small arms and light weapons in the Register in paragraph 45 of his report on uniting against terrorism (A/60/825) and in his note submitting the report of the Group of Governmental Experts on the continuing operation of the United Nations Register of Conventional Arms and its further development to the General Assembly in August 2006 (A/61/261).

11. The Member States of the European Union agree that transparency in armaments is important and that measures aimed at enhancing such transparency should be developed. However, the Union would like to point out that measures in the field of conventional arms should be distinguished from those aimed at increased transparency in the field of weapons of mass destruction. If such a distinction is not made, the viability of the Register would be affected and increased participation and transparency jeopardized.

12. The Member States of the European Union for their part will continue to participate actively in all appropriate forums and to discuss transparency measures that can contribute to increased confidence and greater security among all Member States of the United Nations. In the period leading up to the next review of the

operation of the Register, and thus the next opportunity for further development, in 2009, the EU would like to stress the importance of bringing the universal and consistent participation to the Register under the attention of United Nations Member States and collecting their input for the planned Group of Governmental Experts in 2009. In that respect, the Union believes that regional initiatives, such as regional United Nations workshops on transparency in armaments, can effectively contribute to the awareness and involvement of all United Nations Member States necessary for a successful review in 2009.
