# Offers by Member States of study and training facilities for inhabitants of Non-Self-Governing Territories

**Report of the Secretary-General** 

### Summary

The present report is submitted pursuant to General Assembly resolution 69/100 and is a compilation of replies from Member States related to scholarships and training facilities made available to the inhabitants of Non-Self-Governing Territories.

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## I. Introduction

- 1. By General Assembly resolution 845 (IX), Member States were invited to extend to the inhabitants of Non-Self-Governing Territories offers of facilities not only for study and training of university standard but also for study at the post primary level, as well as technical and vocational training of immediate practical value.
- 2. In accordance with General Assembly resolution 1696 (XVI), offers extended under resolution 845 (IX) are communicated by the Secretariat to the administering Powers to enable them to give appropriate publicity to the offers in the Territories under their administration.
- 3. Information on scholarships offered by Member States under the programme is made available to prospective applicants. Reference to the programme has been included in successive editions of the guide entitled *Study Abroad*, published by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.
- 4. Under the terms of resolution 845 (IX) and subsequent resolutions, the most recent of which is resolution 69/100, the Secretary-General submits to the General Assembly each year a report containing detailed information on the offers made and the extent to which they were utilized. The present report, which covers the period from 5 March 2014 to 5 March 2015, is submitted in accordance with paragraph 5 of resolution 69/100.

### II. Scholarship offers and awards

### A. Offering States

5. Over the years, the 62 States Members of the United Nations listed below have offered to make scholarships available for the use of inhabitants of Non-Self-Governing Territories in response to the relevant General Assembly resolutions:

Algeria, Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Barbados, Brazil, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Cuba, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Egypt, Finland, Gabon, Germany, Ghana, Greece, Hungary, India, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Ireland, Israel, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Libya, Malawi, Malaysia, Malta, Mexico, New Zealand, Norway, Pakistan, Panama, Philippines, Poland, Portugal, Qatar, Romania, Russian Federation, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, South Africa, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Syrian Arab Republic, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand, Tunisia, Turkey, Uganda, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Uruguay and Yugoslavia.

6. One non-member State, the Holy See, has also offered scholarships.

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### B. Offers and awards

#### **Member States**

### **Argentina**

7. In a note verbale dated 20 January 2015, the Permanent Mission of Argentina to the United Nations informed the Secretariat of the following:

The United Nations General Assembly, in its resolution 2065 (XX) and in subsequent resolutions, and the Special Committee on decolonization have described the question of the Malvinas Islands as a special and particular colonial situation as it involves a sovereignty dispute between the Argentine Republic and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, have established that the way to put an end to the sovereignty dispute is the peaceful and negotiated solution of the sovereignty dispute and have requested both Governments to continue without delay the bilateral negotiations.

Despite the illegal British occupation, because the Malvinas Islands, South Georgia Islands and South Sandwich Islands are part of the Argentine national territory, their inhabitants have equality of access with the rest of the Argentine population to the Argentine public education system. This includes free education at the primary, secondary and tertiary/university levels, as well as the benefits of the national scholarship programme offered by the Ministry of Education of the Argentine Republic.

#### Cuba

8. In a note verbale dated 14 February 2015, the Permanent Mission of Cuba to the United Nations informed the Secretariat of the number of scholarships, covering current and previous periods, offered by the Government of Cuba to students of the Non-Self-Governing Territories, as follows:

### **New Zealand**

9. In a communication dated 17 February 2015, the Permanent Mission of New Zealand to the United Nations informed the Secretariat of the following:

The Government of New Zealand provides budget support to the Government of Tokelau to provide and administer scholarships. Tokelau provides scholarships for undergraduate students at tertiary education institutions in the Pacific and New Zealand.

The Government of New Zealand is also providing seven short-term training awards (for up to one year of study). These include an award for fisheries training and six awards for vocational skills that have been prioritized by the three atoll communities. In addition, residents of Tokelau benefit from workshops and

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customized training delivered by various regional programmes that the Government of New Zealand funds.

As New Zealand citizens, Tokelauans are also eligible for a range of domestic scholarships as well as Government-subsidized access to New Zealand education facilities.

#### **Spain**

10. In a note verbale dated 17 February 2015, the Permanent Mission of Spain to the United Nations informed the Secretariat of the following regarding scholarships, covering current and previous periods, for the inhabitants of the Non-Self-Governing Territories:

Specifically, Spain has granted a total of 55 scholarships to students from Western Sahara between 2002 and 2012: eleven in 2002, eight in 2003, 2004 and 2005, six in 2006, one in 2007 and 2008, two in 2009, three in 2010, five in 2011 and two in 2012.

No scholarships have been granted to students from any of the Territories identified for the academic year 2014/15. For the 2015/16 academic year, Saharan students not residing in Spain will be able to apply for scholarships under the following programmes:

- Grants for researchers in development studies
- Official Master's Degree grants in areas relating to development
- Musical training scholarships for citizens from priority countries in Spanish development assistance activities.

### **United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland**

11. In a communication dated 20 February 2015, the Permanent Mission of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to the United Nations informed the Secretariat of the following:

The Foreign and Commonwealth Office provides Chevening scholarships for full or partial funding for full-time courses at the postgraduate level, normally a one-year master's degree. In 2014/15 it granted awards to three students from the UK overseas territories. In addition, British overseas territories citizens are eligible to study at UK universities and higher education institutes at the same "home student" fee as UK students (which is significantly lower than the overseas student rate). In addition, the Foreign and Commonwealth Office funds secondments and other training opportunities for overseas territory civil servants under its Jubilee Fund. In financial year 2014/15 GBP 435,000 was allocated for such training.

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## III. Applications made through the United Nations

- 12. In accordance with the procedure established by the General Assembly in its resolution 1696 (XVI), applications for scholarships received by the United Nations Secretariat from inhabitants of Non-Self-Governing Territories are transmitted simultaneously to the offering States for consideration and to the administering Powers for information.
- 13. From 5 March 2014 to 5 March 2015, no requests for information on the availability of scholarships were received by the Secretariat.

## IV. Conclusion

14. Scholarships and training facilities offered by Member States to the inhabitants of Non-Self-Governing Territories represent a valuable contribution to their educational advancement.

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
