

Appointment of members and alternate members of the United Nations Staff Pension Committee

Note by the Secretary-General

1. As indicated in document A/77/107, the General Assembly is required, at its current session, to appoint one member to fill the vacancy that arose in the membership of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Committee from the resignation of Tomoya Yamaguchi (Japan), for the remaining period of the term of office of Mr. Yamaguchi, which expires on 31 December 2024.

2. The Government of Japan has nominated Yamada Jun for appointment to fill the vacancy.

3. In a communication dated 14 October 2022, the Secretariat was informed by the Chair of the Group of Asia-Pacific States that the candidature of Mr. Yamada had been endorsed by the group.
