Statement by the Foreign Ministry of the Russian Federation on the tenth anniversary of the signing of the Treaty between the Russian Federation and the United States of America on Measures for the Further Reduction and Limitation of Strategic Offensive Arms

On 8 April 2010, the Russian Federation and the United States of America signed the Treaty on Measures for the Further Reduction and Limitation of Strategic Offensive Arms (New START). The Treaty was an important new step in developing interaction between Russia and the United States around nuclear weapons control in the interests of strengthening international security and strategic stability. It led to a reduction in the strategic arsenals of the two countries to unprecedented levels and the formation of an effective mechanism assuring mutual transparency and predictability. Since the New START came into effect, the parties have conducted over 300 reciprocal inspections at each other's strategic facilities and have exchanged nearly 20,000 notifications. Matters related to the implementation of the Treaty are reviewed regularly by the Bilateral Consultative Commission established for that purpose.

The role and importance of the Treaty are growing significantly in today's difficult international conditions, as it remains effectively the only mechanism of arms control and limitation in relation to the strategic weapons of our two countries. We believe that this proven mechanism must be maintained and must remain viable. We are convinced that this would meet the interests of both Russia and the United States, as well as those of the entire international community, would guarantee predictability in the nuclear weapons sphere and would help maintain strategic stability.

On the initiative of Russian President Vladimir Putin, in December 2019, an official offer was made, without preconditions, to the American side to extend the New START and to begin working through related practical issues. We look forward to a speedy and positive response from the United States.
