1. At its fifty-eighth session, held in Vienna from 1 to 12 April 2019, the Legal Subcommittee of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space endorsed the agreement of its Working Group on the Definition and Delimitation of Outer Space to invite States Members of the United Nations and permanent observers of the Committee to provide information relating to any practical case known to them that would warrant the definition and delimitation of outer space ([A/AC.105/1203](#), para. 86 and annex II, para. 9 (e)).
