

The additional information concerns a change of status of the space object. The space object was no longer operational as at 13 October 2022 and the expected date of re-entry into the Earth's atmosphere is December 2036.

The space object referred to above is included in the national part of the Netherlands registry of objects launched into outer space (Register ruimtevoorwerpen).¹
