Note verbale dated 19 October 2020 from the Permanent Mission of Guatemala to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of Guatemala to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with paragraph 1 of General Assembly resolution 1721 B (XVI) of 20 December 1961, has the honour to refer to the launch of the Quetzal 1 satellite on 28 April 2020 as part of the KiboCUBE programme (see annex). The Quetzal 1 satellite was developed by the Universidad del Valle de Guatemala and launched using the SpaceX Falcon 9 CRS-20 vehicle.<sup>1</sup>
