Information furnished in conformity with General Assembly resolution 1721 B (XVI) by States launching objects into orbit or beyond

Note verbale dated 1 April 2022 from the Permanent Mission of Guatemala to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of Guatemala to the United Nations (Vienna) has the honour to provide the following information on the re-entry of the Quetzal 1 satellite into the Earth's atmosphere.

In accordance with General Assembly resolution 1721 B (XVI) of 20 December 1961, the Government of Guatemala hereby reports that the Quetzal 1 satellite, which was built by the Universidad del Valle de Guatemala and launched into space on 28 April 2020, re-entered Earth's atmosphere and ceased to be in orbit on 27 February 2022 at 3.30 a.m. (Guatemala time).¹

The Permanent Mission of Guatemala requests that this information be recorded and communicated to Member States.
