Аккредитация соответствующих неправительственных организаций и других основных групп на Конференции

Записка секретариата*

На своей первой сессии Подготовительный комитет утвердил предложенные механизмы аккредитации соответствующих неправительственных организаций и других основных групп для последующего участия во Всемирной конференции по уменьшению опасности бедствий и в процессе ее подготовки. Секретариат Конференции получил заявления от неправительственных организаций и других основных групп, список которых приводится в приложении, и рекомендует Конференции предоставить им аккредитацию.

^{*} Настоящий документ был представлен с опозданием из-за возникшей необходимости в проведении широких внутренних и внешних консультаций.

1. В пункте 16 своей резолюции 58/214 от 23 декабря 2003 года Генеральная Ассамблея призвала все основные группы, определенные в Повестке дня на XXI век, внести действенный вклад во Всемирную конференцию по уменьшению опасности бедствий и предложила им обратиться за аккредитацией на Конференции и в ее подготовительном процессе.

2. На своей второй сессии (см. A/CONF.206/PC(II)/10, пункты 25 и 26) Подготовительный комитет одобрил рекомендацию секретариата относительно участия 55 неправительственных организаций и других основных групп, перечисленных в документах A/CONF.206/PC(II)/7 и Add.1. Вместе с тем, ввиду возросшего интереса к участию в работе Конференции среди неправительственных организаций и других основных групп Бюро Подготовительного комитета согласилось продлить крайний срок подачи заявлений до 30 ноября 2004 года.

3. Секретариат Конференции получил и оценил заполненные заявления, которые были получены до 30 ноября 2004 года, в соответствии с критериями и процедурами аккредитации, принятыми на первой сессии Подготовительного комитета (см. A/CONF.206/PC(I)/6, пункты 28 и 29). Список неправительственных организаций и других основных групп, рекомендованных секретариатом Конференции к аккредитации содержится в приложении, выпускаемом только на английском, испанском и французском языках. На момент подготовки настоящего документа нет ни одной организации, которую секретариат Конференции не рекомендовал бы к аккредитации. Заявления, полученные после 30 ноября 2004 года, не принимались.
