On 9th November 1946 the accused John D'Souza was convicted and sentenced by the Chief Presy. Magistrate to undergo three months' R.I. and Fine of Rs.1,000 (U.S. \$ 301.70) or indefault further R.I. for three months. Second accused Baptist D'Souza discharged for want of evidence in this case. Accused No. 3 not traced.
