OUR WORLD 2000



In a continuation of the celebration of the new millennium through the issue of postage stamps, the United Nations Postal Administration will release a set of six commemorative stamps on the theme **Our World 2000** on 30 May 2000. Each stamp will reproduce a painting which was submitted to the Winsor & Newton Worldwide Millennium Painting Competition on the theme **My Country in the Year 2000**.
- 2. The stamps are in denominations of S.Fr. 0,90, S.Fr. 1,10, 33 cents, 60 cents, AS 7/Euro 0,51 and AS 8/Euro 0,58.

US\$ 0,60_: Painted in acrylic on canvas in 1999, Crossing is the work of Masakazu Takahata (Japan).
