## Доклад Норвегии об осуществлении резолюции 1540 (2004) Совета Безопасности

Норвегия с удовлетворение препровождает настоящим обновленную национальную матрицу о выполнении ею резолюции 1540 (2004) Совета Безопасности и обязанностей по нераспространению, содержащихся в резолюциях 1673 (2006), 1810 (2008), 1977 (2011), 2055 (2012) и 2325 (2016) (см. добавление)<sup>1</sup>.

Норвегия считает, что резолюция 1540 (2004) Совета Безопасности попрежнему является одним из жизненно важных элементов международной архитектуры нераспространения. В этой резолюции Совет установил для всех государств обязательства принимать и применять эффективные меры в целях установления национального контроля для предотвращения распространения ядерного, химического или биологического оружия и средств его доставки, в том числе посредством установления надлежащего контроля над относящимися к ним материалами. Он призвал также содействовать международному диалогу и сотрудничеству с тем, чтобы противостоять угрозе распространения.

Угроза, которая исходит от негосударственных субъектов, нарастает. Поскольку эта угроза носит транснациональный характер, для ее устранения необходимо международное сотрудничество. Мировое сообщество несет совместную ответственность за усиление и соблюдение соответствующих норм и правил в целях укрепления глобальной стабильности, безопасности и развития. Норвегия остается горячим приверженцем придания универсального характера многосторонним режимам, нацеленным на предотвращение распространения ядерного, биологического и химического оружия, таким как Договор о нераспространении ядерного оружия, Конвенция о химическом оружии и Конвенция о биологическом оружии, а также приверженцем укрепления таких режимов.

Их всестороннее соблюдение всеми государствами — членами Организации Объединенных Наций имеет решающее значение. Норвегия стремится к сотрудничеству со всеми государствами и соответствующими сторонами для наращивания усилий по обеспечению всеобщего осуществления резолюции 1540 (2004).

Matrix entries are only indicators of fact and not indicators of the degree of compliance under resolution 1540 (2004) and its successor resolutions. Thus:

An "X" in any data field signifies only that the 1540 Committee considers that a State has taken the steps required, and/or has provided specific references to the applicable legal basis or executive behaviour as evidence of such steps. An "X" against any data field does not necessarily signify that a State has met in full its 1540 obligations for that data field.

A "?" in any data field signifies that the references to legislative or other measures may not be directly relevant or are incomplete.

A "NA" (Not Applicable) in any data field signifies that the data field is not applicable to that State where through legally binding instruments States specified that they do not possess related materials or facilities.

A blank in any data field signifies that there is insufficient information available to enter an "X" or "?" against a particular data field.
