



Information furnished in conformity with the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space

Note verbale dated 17 May 2023 from the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution [3235 \(XXIX\)](#), annex), has the honour to transmit data on space launches by the Russian Federation in April 2023 and on previously launched space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).



Annex

Registration data on space objects launched by the Russian Federation in April 2023*

1. In April 2023, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects included, in accordance with established practice and its international obligations, in the register of space objects launched by the Russian Federation and over which it exercises jurisdiction and control.
2. In April 2023, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects on behalf of foreign clients.
3. As at 2400 hours Moscow time on 30 April 2023, no space objects belonging to the Russian Federation had been found to have ceased to exist in Earth orbit in April 2023.
