The Permanent Mission of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article II, paragraph 2, of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution 3235 (XXIX), annex), which states that "Where there are two or more launching States in respect of any such space object, they shall jointly determine which one of them shall register the object", confirms that the space object ICO F2 has been owned and operated by a United States company since 2012 and therefore will be held on the national registry of the United States of America (see annex).¹
