Information furnished in conformity with the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space

Note verbale dated 22 April 2014 from the Permanent Mission of Mexico to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of Mexico to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution 3235 (XXIX), annex) and, in particular, article IV, paragraph 3, has the honour to request that the Secretary-General cancel the registration of the Solidaridad 2 satellite (previously registered in document ST/SRG/SER.E/670), whose owner was the company Satélites Mexicanos, S.A. de C.V. (see annex).

The Permanent Mission has the further honour to inform the Secretary-General that the aforementioned satellite was deorbited owing to the fact that it had reached the end of its useful life, thus removing space debris from the geostationary satellite orbit.
