

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution 3235 (XXIX), annex), has the honour to transmit registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation in January 2018 and also on the space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).







Annex

Registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation in January 2018*

- In January 2018, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects included, in accordance with established practice and its international obligations, in the register of space objects launched by the Russian Federation and over which it has control.
- In January 2018, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects on behalf of foreign clients.
- At 2400 hours Moscow time on 31 January 2018, no space objects belonging to the Russian Federation had been found to have ceased to exist in Earth orbit in January 2018.
