

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution 3235 (XXIX), annex), has the honour to transmit registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation in September and October 2018 and also on the space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annexes I and II).







Annex I

Registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation in September 2018*

- 1. In September 2018, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects included, in accordance with established practice and its international obligations, in the register of space objects launched by the Russian Federation and over which it exercises jurisdiction and control.
- 2. In September 2018, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects on behalf of foreign clients.
- 3. The following space object ceased to exist in September 2018 and was no longer in Earth orbit as at 2400 hours Moscow time on 30 September 2018:

1975-063A (Molniya 2-13): burned up on 12 September 2018.
