Note verbale dated 14 February 2019 from the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution 3235 (XXIX), annex), has the honour to transmit registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation in January 2019 and also on the space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).

Registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation in January 2019*

1. In January 2019, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects included, in accordance with established practice and its international obligations, in the register of space objects launched by the Russian Federation and over which it exercises jurisdiction and control.

2. In January 2019, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects on behalf of foreign clients.

3. The following space objects ceased to exist in January 2019 and were no longer in Earth orbit as at 2400 hours Moscow time on 31 January 2019:

2007-049A (Cosmos-2430), which burned up on 5 January 2019;

1977-093A (Prognoz-6), which burned up on 16 January 2019;

2018-058A (Progress MS-09), which was deorbited into the Pacific Ocean at a predetermined location on 25 January 2019; fragments of the space object that had not burned up were sunk.
