**Information furnished in conformity with the Convention
on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space**

**Note verbale dated 18 June 2020 from the Permanent Mission of
the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed
to the Secretary-General**

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution 3235 (XXIX), annex), has the honour to transmit data on space launches by the Russian Federation in May 2020 and on previously launched space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).¹

¹ The data on the space object referenced in the annex were entered into the Register of Objects Launched into Outer Space on 24 June 2020.

1. In May 2020, the following space object under the jurisdiction and control of the Russian Federation was launched:
