

## Information furnished in conformity with the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space

Note verbale dated 9 June 2021 from the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution 3235 (XXIX), annex), has the honour to transmit data on space launches by the Russian Federation in May 2021 and on previously launched space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).<sup>1</sup>

## Annex

## Registration data on space objects launched by the Russian Federation in May 2021\*

- In May 2021, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects included, in accordance with established practice and its international obligations, in the register of space objects launched by the Russian Federation and over which it exercises jurisdiction and control.
- In May 2021, the Russian Federation launched the following space objects on behalf of a foreign client: On 28 May 2021, 36 OneWeb satellites (mission 47) (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) were launched by a Soyuz-2-1b carrier rocket with a Fregat upper stage from the Vostochny launch site.
- As at 2400 hours Moscow time on 31 May 2021, no space objects belonging to the Russian Federation had been found to have ceased to exist in Earth orbit in May 2021.
