

## PETITION FROM MR. B. NIUNGUKA CONCERNING RUANDA-URUNDI

(Circulated in accordance with rule 85 and supplementary rule F of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council)

Note by the Secretariat: This communication was transmitted to the Secretary-General by the United Nations Visiting Mission to Trust Territories in East Africa.

Usumbura, 25 July 1954.

The United Nations Visiting Mission,
Usumbura.

I am very happy to learn that you are visiting Ruanda-Urundi. Your stay in Usumbura will be of great assistance to me because at the present moment I am in trouble, and I presume that I must apply to you in order that you may help me.

I was arrested by the Authority on 23 May last and some days later was sentenced to penal servitude for three years and twenty-one days for reasons unknown to me.

May I ask you kindly to grant me a hearing before you leave Usumbura for Kitega, etc.?

Hoping that my request will be considered and thanking you in advance, I am etc.
