Note y the Secretariat: The petitions circulated in this document all contain complaints concerning material damage and property losses resulting from the incidents of May 1955 in the Mbanga Subdivision, Mungo Region. The petitions have been assembled in a single document in order to facilitate their examination by members of the Trusteeship Council. The Secretariat has grouped together the various articles enumerated in the excessively long lists attached to certain petitions; in such cases the abridged lists are given in square brackets.

## 1. Petition from Mrs. Agathe Sikam

From: Sikam Agathe, member of the UDEFEC, Banana Company, Loum Administrative Sector, Mungo Region

To: The Secretary-General of the United Nations, New York

Kamerun was devastated by a cold war unleashed by Mr. Roland Pré, French Governor in Kamerun,

against an unarmed people who are claiming their legitimate rights, that is, the immediate Unification and Independence of Kamerun.

At Loum, on 25 May 1955, the huts of active members of the UPC were looted and set on fire, with the help of Chad soldiers; many patriots were arrested, imprisoned and deported, and have died or disappeared.

During these incidents a woman named Mappe was killed; I still do not know what has happened to her mother, Noubwe Odette.

#### Claims

I ask for the immediate Unification and Independence of Kamerun, the termination of the period of trusteeship in our country;

I ask for the appointment of a United Nations High Commissioner in Kamerun.

I ask for the adoption of a red flag with a crab in the centre.

# 5. Petition from Mr. Henri Teuh (Theu) 3/

#### PROPERTY REPORT of:

Teuh Henri, planter and tradesman-carrier, member of the Loum-Chantiers Central Committee in the maguis

To the Secretary-General of the United Nations, New York Sir,

I have been in the <u>maquis</u> ever since 25 May 1955, although I have a family and am a businessman, holding a licence in a very thriving shop. All my goods were looted and people were massacred by the French colonialists in their cowardly war, directed by the bloodthirsty Roland Pré on behalf of France, the so-called civilizer, in the name of the United Nations.

Since that time I have had no news of the employees who worked on my lorry and I do not know where the lorry and my employees are.

I have learned that the colonialists have driven out all my wives and the children; as a result of this savage repression they have my daughter, named Mapé Jeanne.

The looting and massacres have cost me the following:

#### DECLARATION

Having been a victim of the incidents of May 1955, I lost the belongings listed below, by order of Mr. Roland Pré, High Commissioner of the French Republic in the Cameroons, accompanied by the Chief of the M'Banga Subdivision, the Chief of the Administrative Post and the Brigade Commandant of LOUM, the foreign chiefs, MONGUE NENGKEU and BETCHEM Garba, and a troop of soldiers from CHAD, who had been ordered to cause all possible damage.
